This mantra, commonly known as Gāyatrī or Sāvitrī (Rgveda III 62.10) belongs to the most frequently recited and reused religious texts of mankind. Since its composition more than 3000 years ago, it has developed into what has variously been called the most important, most efficacious or holiest mantra of Hinduism. Although it invokes a male god, in the course of time the mantra has even been venerated as a goddess itself. How did this come about?

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
